

Grant Road IMPROVEMENT PLAN



PHASES 5 & 6 – FREMONT AVE to SPARKMAN BLVD

May 2026

The final phases of the Grant Road Improvement Plan will enhance the roadway between Fremont Avenue and Sparkman Boulevard. This Regional Transportation Authority plan project is managed by the City of Tucson. The design for Phases 5 & 6 is underway to prepare for reconstruction of this segment of Grant Road.

When complete, the east-west corridor will greatly improve regional mobility by adding a travel lane in

each direction and include significant enhancements to improve transit, bicycle and pedestrian use, and safety.

New and wider sidewalks, more signalized crosswalks, improved bicycle lanes, and enhanced landscaping will invite both pedestrian and bicyclist use, and improve the appearance of Grant Road. A median and managed access to businesses will improve safety; while new local frontage roads will provide a safer and easier way to get to and from residences in congested areas.

Preliminary Construction Cost Estimate: \$50,000,000 (excludes property acquisitions)

Project Schedule

- 100% Design: Late 2026
- ROW Acquisition: 2026-2027
- Utility Relocation: 2027-2029
- Construction: Begin Summer 2029

Key Project Features

- 6 vehicular travel lanes
- Raised median
- Indirect left turns at Campbell Avenue
- Buffered bike lanes
- Sidewalks on each side of Grant, 5-ft to 8-ft width
- Protected bike/pedestrian street crossings
- Transit accommodations including pullouts, shelters
- Water harvesting and other sustainability features

The Regional Transportation Authority, a state-established taxing subdivision within Pima County, oversees implementation of a 20-year regional transportation plan voters approved on March 10, 2026. The new \$2.67 billion plan will be funded by a half-cent excise (sales) tax also approved in March. The plan and tax went into effect April 1.
