

## UPCOMING WORK FOR PHASES 3 & 4 BETWEEN COUNTRY CLUB ROAD AND COLUMBUS BOULEVARD

Thank you for your interest in the Grant Road Improvement Project Phases 3 & 4.

On **Thursday, November 8, and Friday, November 9, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. each day**, the City of Tucson and its contractor will repave sections of Grant Road and side streets from Sparkman Boulevard to Venice Avenue (generally Country Club Road to Columbus Boulevard) where previous underground utility work took place for the design of Grant Road Phases 3 and 4. Motorists should expect travel-lane and turn restrictions as work progresses through the area. Grant Road access from side streets will also be impacted.

### **Grant Road paving**

Sections of east and westbound Grant Road from Sparkman to Venice - one lane in each direction will be maintained.

### **Side street paving north of Grant Road**

Sparkman Boulevard - southbound lanes restricted  
Palo Verde Boulevard - north and southbound lanes restricted  
Richey Boulevard - southbound lanes restricted  
Dodge Boulevard - northbound lanes restricted  
Haskell Drive - northbound lanes restricted  
Alvernon Way - northbound lanes restricted  
Sycamore Boulevard - southbound lanes restricted  
Walnut Avenue - north and southbound lanes restricted  
Bryant Avenue - southbound lanes restricted  
Columbus Boulevard - southbound lanes restricted

### **Side street paving south of Grant Road**

Sparkman Boulevard - northbound lanes restricted  
Palo Verde Boulevard - southbound lanes restricted  
Dodge Boulevard - southbound lanes restricted

Elaine Boulevard - southbound lanes restricted  
Walnut Avenue - southbound lanes restricted  
Columbus Boulevard - southbound lanes restricted

The speed limit in the construction zone has been reduced to 25 mph and motorists can expect delays while traveling through the work zone. Please obey all traffic control signs and watch for construction personnel and equipment in the work zone. The schedule is subject to change due to equipment malfunction or inclement weather.
