Thank you for your interest in the Grant Road Improvement Project Phase 2.

On **Monday, July 2, 2018, southbound Euclid Avenue at Grant Road will be closed** to travel so that work crews can mill and pave a section of southbound Euclid Avenue. The closure will be in place from about **10:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.** Motorists and bicyclists traveling south on Euclid Avenue at Grant Road will be allowed to turn eastbound or westbound on Grant Road. Northbound travel on Euclid Avenue will not be affected by this work.

On **Tuesday, July 3, 2018, from approximately 5 a.m. to 5 p.m., Park Avenue just south of Grant Road will be closed** to travel to allow work crews to asphalt patch a trench on Park Avenue. During the closure, motorists and bicyclists traveling north on Park Avenue will not have access to Grant Road. Motorists and bicyclists traveling south on Park Avenue approaching Grant Road will be allowed to turn eastbound and westbound on Grant Road. Through travel at the intersection will be prohibited.

Work to widen Grant Road from Stone Avenue to Park Avenue began in March 2017. The improvements include six vehicular travel lanes, protected bike/pedestrian street crossings, drainage improvements, indirect left turns at Stone Avenue and First Avenue, bike lanes and sidewalks, bus pullouts and bus shelters, and public art.

The speed limit in the construction zone has been reduced to 25 mph and motorists can expect delays while traveling through the work zone. Please obey all traffic control signs and watch for construction personnel and equipment in the work zone. The schedule is subject to change due to equipment malfunction or inclement weather.

The project is part of the \$2.1 billion Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) Plan, which will be implemented through 2026. The multimodal plan, nearly halfway through implementation, includes roadway, safety, transit, environmental and economic vitality improvements. This project is managed by the City of Tucson.
